## NATIONAL RED CARPET PREMIERE OF "THE TILLMAN STORY" TO TAKE PLACE AT YALE UNIVERSITY

## MOVIE WILL OPEN A DIALOGUE ON CAMPUS RELATED TO THE HANDLING OF CPL. PAT TILLMAN'S DEATH BY THE MILITARY, THE GOVERNMENT AND THE MEDIA

Yale College Democrats to Host Red Carpet Screening Followed by Townhall Discussion

[New Haven, CT and New York, NY] – Today it was announced that the national red carpet premiere of "The Tillman Story" will take place on the campus of Yale University on Saturday, September 11, 2010 at 7pm. The premiere will be hosted by the Yale College Democrats. Yale recently announced that former General Stanley McChrystal will be teaching a graduate course on leadership at the University. The Tillman Story, a documentary about the life of the late Cpl. Pat Tillman, raises serious questions about the military's role – including General McChrystal's — in the cover up of Cpl. Tillman's death in 2004. Following the screening, which will take place at the Whitney Center on campus, the Yale College Democrats will host a townhall discussion about the movie.

"We are really looking forward to screening the film at Yale and are honored to be working with the Yale College Democrats on the event," said Amir Bar-Lev, director of the film. "The film raises some important issues about the treatment of military families and we are looking forward to hearing the reaction from the Yale community."

"The Tillman Story" is a documentary about the life of the late Cpl. Pat Tillman who lost his life serving in the U.S. Army Rangers in Afghanistan. Tillman, who gave up his professional football career to join the Army Rangers in 2002, was killed in Afghanistan in 2004. Instead of telling the American people, including Tillman's family, the truth about Tillman's death, the military and the government used his death as propaganda for the war. The film is the story about Pat Tillman's life and his family's search for truth and accountability about his death.

"Pat Tillman's story is an important one and we are proud to host the event and open a dialogue among the Yale community about the issues raised in the film," said Ben Stango, President of the Yale College Democrats.

The screening will be followed by a townhall discussion with the film's director, Amir Bar-Lev, Yale Film Professor, Charles Musser, Yale Democrats President X, and X. The
